





SECRETARY'S REPORT



ear Members, Well-wishers and staff, on behalf of MESCO Education Society (MES), it is my privilege to present the Annual Report for the F. Y. 2017-18, which provides a summary of all major activities that our Society has undertaken in the course of this year.

Dr. M.A. Khatkhatay

At the outset I would like to thank God for giving us the

opportunity to serve our fellow human beings through our four educational institutions.

The balance sheet for the year under report shows that the corpus stands at Rs. 6.62 crores while investment are at Rs. 54.46 lacs. The Income Expenditure Account for the same period shows an income of Rs.5.45 crores as against an expenditure of Rs.4.65 crores, leaving a surplus of Rs.80.65 lacs.

On-Line registration of MES is completed on the Charity Commissioner's Portal and Niti Ayog (NGO Darpan) Portal; both the registrations are accepted and approved by the said Govt. agencies.

Mr. Sohrab Shaikh (an IT Professional) and Mrs. Najma Kazi (an Academician) were inducted in the Managing Committee and Sub-Committee respectively. We have been trying to tap CSR Funds for our Institutions and have been able to raise around 23 lakhs from these efforts.

The following is a brief report on our four Educational Institutions:

NURSERY SCHOOLS: MESCO Education Society's Angels' Paradise Nursery Schools is a program that provides stimulating early childhood education. It looks at health, nutrition, cognitive, social & emotional development. The target population is children from low income families. This project was initiated by MESCO (Parent Organization) in 1972. Our Nursery Schools numbering twelve during the year under report, have catered to 362 students between them. We are grateful to all our stake holders and particularly to our teachers for their efforts. 86% of our students were admitted to good English Medium High Schools of their respective area.

Our efforts are to provide a Child Initiated Experiential Learning to the most marginalized section of society and help them to get into good English medium schools of their area.

With a purpose of sharing and getting information on Nursery Schools and Balwadies run by various organizations, MES had conducted a **Round Table Conference** of NGOs on 30th November 2017 at All India Institute of Local Self Government. Totally 6 organizations participated in the same. In April 2017, **Teaching Aids Exhibition** was organized by our Nursery Schools' staff, many Principals and teachers from other schools visited and appreciated the efforts of

our staff. We wish to place on record our gratitude to all the 8 sponsors of our Nursery Schools.

E.C.C.Ed. COURSE: The year under report has been a notable year, in that we have started the Early Child Care and Education (E.C.C.Ed.) Teachers' Training Course. We are proud to share that our first batch of 15 students all got placed in reputed schools. We have applied to SNDT University for their affiliation of the course and are hopeful that we will get the affiliation soon. We took the lead to start this course in the area where none existed. A preschool can be a positive and effective force in constructively channeling and focusing children's energies and broadening their horizons as well as helping them to learn skills with which they can continue learning for the rest of their lives.

First 6 years of life are the most important in terms of learning and need good trained teachers to provide the learning /teaching skills. Teachers training is very crucial to providing the stimulation.

We are grateful to one of our donors for financially supporting this programme.

CRESCENT ENGLISH HIGH SCHOOL & JR. COLLEGE:

MES Crescent English High School and Junior College is one of the most reputed schools in Mumbra, Thane, serving the schooling needs of the area for the past 25 years. It strives to inculcate joyful, holistic and value based education. The strength of our school & Jr. College in 2017-2018 was 1393 students with 40 teaching staff, 8 non teaching staff and 12 auxiliary staff. Mr. Wasi Khan (a highly qualified and dedicated Educationist) with his dedicated and supportive team continues the good work of the school.

Our students have made us proud; of the 64 students who appeared for SSC exams, 37 secured distinction (10 of these securing 90% and above), 25 first class, 02 second class with highest score of 94.40% and class average percentage of 77.32%.

HSC results of our first batch (Commerce stream): of the 51 students, 11 students secured distinction, 33 first class and 07 second class with highest score of 86.62%. The science stream result was 98.46% with 2 students securing distinction, 39 a first class, 23 a second class where the highest percentage was 84.46%.

The school is also well known for providing the best infrastructure and all round development of students. We have incorporated E-learning for Std. I to X with CBM software. This provides great support through audio visual approach in addition to the normal chalk and talk method. On 21st & 22nd January 2018 the school had organized Edufiesta (an exhibition on all subjects of the prescribed syllabus and projects of college students); more than 1800 students, parents, teachers and Principals from other schools attended this event.

The school is an English medium unaided, Minority institute following the State Board curriculum at Primary, Secondary & Higher Secondary level and has successfully made numerous interventions in our pedagogy and providing an all round development through various extra & co-curricular activities, including competitive opportunities to its students.

Our students appeared for the All India Talent Examination in Mathematics, Science, English, Cyber & General Knowledge organized by Science Olympiad Foundation (SOF), English Marathon Examination registered with Maharashtra State Board, Maharashtra State Scholarship Examination, the Rehmani 30 examinations, Maharashtra Talent Search (MTS) Examinations and Drawing Elementary & Intermediate Examination. The students & staff actively participate in the Interschool Science Exhibition every year. This year one of our Science Teachers received 1st prize in Science Exhibition conducted by the Education Department while another Science teacher bagged the 1st position at the 42nd State Level Science Exhibition held at Sangli.

The School has always been taking initiatives to get the best talent in the sports arena. 4 of our boys and 3 girls were selected for State level Volley Ball Competition held at Thane. 3 students got selected for the Mumbai Divisional Yoga Competition. 18 students of Jr. College secured runner up position in the Box Cricket Match.

Conserve My Planet activity conducted in collaboration with Sharp (NGO) & Schneider India Ltd to inculcate the value of energy resources in young minds for sustainable development. For the last three years the school has been participating in the Inter School Competition, out of the 19 schools which participated, our school won 5 awards. In view of safety and security of our students, a comprehensive School Safety and Security Policy was developed and implemented.

All the good work of the school has been possible with the support of the Management, dedicated faculty and supportive parents. We would like to thank all our parents, well-wishers and staff for their co-operation.

MESVTC: MESCO Education Society's Vocational Training Centre (MESVTC) in collaboration with Fr. Agnel Technical College, Bandra, has been instrumental for training the next generation in different trades. We have 2 Centres, one at Dharavi (where we conducted 2 trades viz Beautician and Tailoring) and other at Kausa Mumbra (where we conducted Electrician, AC Refrigeration, Dress Making, Beautician and IT Course). MESVTC aims to provide training to boys and girls from weaker section of society so that they make utmost use of their newly acquired talents, achieve better economic status. In the last 9 years, we have trained and skilled more than 605 boys and 549 girls in different trades. During the previous year, we have trained 92 boys and 110 girls.

Passed out students were awarded Certificates at the Students' Felicitation Function, held on 23rd September 2017. Ms. Aysha Khan (Political Specialist from US Consulate, Mumbai) was the Chief Guest. After completing the courses, students are employed in different Govt & Private sectors and earning decent income supporting their families. Feedback collected from past students was compiled and printed in the form of **Ex-Students' Directory**, which was released on 17th December 2017 by Ms. Farogh Mukadam (Dy. Collector, Thane).

With a vision to equip dropout students, with a skill, we established 2 Vocational Training Centers in collaboration with Fr. Agnel Technical College.

We are very much grateful to M/s. Voltas Ltd. for supporting our Refrigeration and Air Conditioning (RAC) Course.

NEW SCHOOL PROJECT: For the New School Project (on Thane Municipal Corporation's allotted plot), we have appointed M/s. Makarand Toraskar and Associates as Consulting Architect and M/s. Associated Consultants as RCC Consultant. A complete project report was prepared and according to the requirement of the said report, the said Architect was briefed to develop the Municipal Drawing for the New School Building. After thorough discussions, the drawings (Plans) for the New School Building were finalized and submitted to Thane Municipal Corporation (TMC) for their approval. During this year, we have paid the fourth installment (of 5 installments) of Rs. 62 lacs to TMC towards the Bid Premium for the said plot. We are thankful to our donors who contributed and committed for the construction of the New School Building as also to Rogay Charities for their support towards the total Bid Premium being paid to TMC for the plot.

We are hopeful that with our passion and support from well-wishers and donors, we shall realize the dream of establishing yet another magnificent school on the plot allotted by Thane Municipal Corporation.

Overall MES had a very positive year. On behalf of the Managing Committee I would like to extend my sincere thanks to M/s. Contractor, Nayak & Kishnadwala, our Auditors. Finally, as I end this report, I have to thank all my Committee Members, Staff Members, Patron and Life Members, CSR Partners, Well-Wishers and donors too numerous to name individually, and but for whom, we could not have achieved all this success in our endeavours. We thank the Almighty for accepting our services and guiding us all the way.


We, the undersigned Auditors hereby report.

- I) Significant Accounting Policy
- a) The financial statements are prepared in accordance with historical cost convention.
- b) Accounts are maintained on accrual basis.
- 2) Fixed Assets and Depreciation Fixed Asset stated at cost. Depreciation is provided on Fixed Assets on WDV method as rate prescribed in the Income Tax Act 1961.
- 3) Investments are stated at cost of acquisition.
 Adjustment for Surplus/Deficit is accounted for or on realization of investment.
- 4) Previous year figure has been regrouped, recast wherever necessary.
- II) The trust has been granted approval to accept donations under section 35AC of the Income Tax Act 1961 vide notification no. S.O. 1632 (E) dated 17-06-2015 by the G.O.I. Ministry of Finance, National Committee for Promotion of Social and Economic Welfare (Department of Revenue), New Delhi subject to conditions as specified in the said Notification. The project for which the approval was granted related to Purchasing Premises for our Vocational Training Centre and conducting/sustaining this activity involving a total cost of Rs. 2.97 crores for three financial years commencing from 2015-16. During the year the Trust received donation of Rs. 0/- Cumulative Rs. 6,75,817/- as donations U/s 35AC of Income Tax Act 1961 against which Rs. 6,63,463/- Cumulative Rs. 6,63,463/- is utilized during the year.
- III)The trust has been granted approval to accept donations under section 35AC of the Income Tax Act 1961 vide notification no. S.O. 2854 (E) dated 16-10-2015 by the G.O.I. Ministry of Finance, National Committee for Promotion of Social and Economic Welfare (Department of Revenue), New Delhi subject to conditions as specified in the said Notification. The project for which the approval was granted relates to School Construction Project and conducting/ sustaining this activity in Rural area at a total cost of Rs. 12.00 crores for three financial years commencing from 2015-16. During the year the Trust received donation of Rs. O/-. Cumulative Rs. 1,76,97,689/- (incl. Bank Interest of Rs. 4,07,379/-) as donations U/s 35AC of Income Tax Act 1961 against which Rs. 1,74,85,816/- Cumulative Rs. 1,74,85,816/is utilized during the year.

WHY ANOTHER SCHOOL IN THE SAME AREA?

umbra Kausa is a developing town near Thane city in Maharashtra State of India. The area is rapidly growing both in terms of population and residential buildings due to migration of low income group families who cannot afford to pay rising cost of living in Mumbai City. Most of the people are from lower middle class engaged in petty jobs and small businesses. There are many schools in the area; however, the need for schools providing quality education is glaring. 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




